W.W. Gordon Dead

Assistant Yardmaster of Terminal Company, 60 Years Old

William W. Gordon, 60 years old, assistant yardmaster for the Washington Terminal Co., died at his residence, 1700 First street northeast, yesterday, after a short illness.

Mr. Gordon's first railroad experience was when he went to work for the Pennsylvania Railroad in 1882, and he worked for many years in the yards of the old Sixth Street Station here. He had been employed by the Washington Terminal Co. since the formal opening of Union Station. He was a member of the Brotherhood of Trainmen.

Mr. Gordon is survived by his widow, Mrs. Mary M. Gordon, and a daughter, Miss Myrtelle M. Gordon.

Funeral services will be conducted at the residence tomorrow afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. Rev. Dr. James H. Taylor, pastor of the Central Presbyterian Church will officiate. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.
