William M. Graham Dies

Body of Spanish War Veteran Buried in Congressional Cemetery

William Montrose Graham, son of the late Maj. Gen. William Montrose and Mary Ricketts Graham, died at Nogalea, Ariz., April 4. Interment was at the family plot in Congressional cemetery this morning. Mr. Graham is survived by his mother, three sisters, Mrs. Guy H. Burrage, Mrs. Carroll S. Alden and Mrs. Archibald H. Seales, and a brother, Lieut, Col. J. Malcolm Graham, U.S.A.

Mr. Graham was born at Fort Warren, in Boston harbor, in 1878. He served in the Spanish American war as first lieutenant in the 14th Pennsylvania Volunteers, and in 1901 was commissioned second lieutenant in the Regular Army, and assigned to the 12th Cavalry. He served with his regiment in Texas from 1901 to 1903, and in the Philippines from 1903 to 1905, and was honorably discharged in 1905 on account of injuries received in line of duty.
