Between the 1940s and early 1970s, she developed properties in Georgetown and Alexandria, owned two area drug stores, and an inn and farm near Warrenton, Va. She developed Beaufort Port Estates in Fulton, Md.

Mrs. Gray was a 1939 graduate of George Washington University and earned a law degree there in 1941. During World War II, she did volunteer work for the Red Cross. After the war, she worked for a time as a journalist in Europe.

She was a past president of the Club of Colonial Dames of Washington, and was a charter member of the Soroptomist Club of Falls Church.

Her marriage to George O. Gray ended in divorce. She leaves no immediate survivors.
