G.L. Grinder Stricken On Visit to Bermuda

George L. Grinder, 66, of 4102 Pennsylvania ave. se., died Tuesday while visiting his son, S/Sergt. George H. Grinder in Bermuda, it was learned here yesterday.

M. Grinder was stricken with a heart attack and died at Kindley Field Air Base Hotel.

A native of Washington, he lived in the area all his life. He retired from the Naval Gun Factory in 1947 after 43 years of work there. Recently he had been connected with Miller Jewelers, 326 Pennsylvania ave. se.
