Former Pennsylvania Conductor Expires After Operation

Ernest T. Hagan, 52, former conductor of the Pennsylvania Railroad, died at Sibley Hospital, following an operation early yesterday morning. He had been ill about three days.

Mr. Hagan was born and reared in Washington. He resided in Pittsburgh for a number of years.
