Injuries From Auto Fatal Machine Which Hit J.H. Hall Said to Have Carried Officers

Struck by an automobile at Delaware avenue and D street southwest about 6 o'clock this morning, John H. Hall, forty years of age, whose home is said to be at 512 7th street southeast, died later at Casualty Hospital.

The automobile that struck Hall, the police say, failed to stop. It is said to have been occupied by a chauffeur and two Army officers. The police are searching for them.

Officers' Car Disappeared

An inquest was held at the morgue yesterday afternoon in the case of John H. Hall, 512 7th street southeast, who was killed by an Army automobile at Delaware avenue and D street southwest early Saturday morning. It was testified that two Army officers and a chauffeur were occupants of the car that killed Hall, and that they neglected to stop to render aid. The jury reported that Hall was killed by an automobile, the occupants of which were unknown.
