Girl Dies Of Poisoning

Note to Friend Said to Have Exonerated Him of Blame

Myrtle Virginia Hall, nineteen years old, of 643 L street southwest, died at Emergency Hospital yesterday afternoon from the effects of a mixture of poisons, according to a police report. She was found unconscious in the home of her sister, Mrs. Mary Ryon, 924 7th street southwest early yesterday morning by her father, William Hall and removed to the hospital immediately.

Police declared that a note found addressed to a man named "Carl," which declared that he could not be blamed for "this," and expressing absence of malice against her family.

Acting Coroner Martyn issued a certificate of death from suicide. The girl was a paroled resident of the National Training School for girls, according to the police.
