Miss Ruth L. Hall, 33 Years With Revenue Service

Miss Ruth Louise Hall, 63, Washington attorney and prominent Eastern Star member, died Tuesday in Sibley Hospital. She lived at 3620 Thirty-eighth street N.W.

Miss Hall retired from the Internal Revenue Service in 1954 after 33 years there. Since her retirement she had been associated with the law firm of Meyers and Batzell. She specialized in estate law.

At her death she was grand representative to the Grand Chapter of Wyoming, Order of the Eastern Star. Other offices she held in that organization included worthy matron of Lebanon Chapter No. 25, in 1939; grand representative to the Grand Chapter of Colorado, 1954 through 1956, and president of the Women's Eastern Star Club of the Treasury Department, in 1945.

Miss Hall was also a member of the board of the Central Union Mission.

She was a member of the Federal Barr Association, and was admitted to the bars of the District Court and the District Court of Appeals

Miss Hall leaves two sisters, Mrs. Margaret Harris of 5710 Gloster road, Woodacres, Md., and Mrs. Esther Beckett of Denver, and a niece, Mrs. Edna Mae Woolf Batzell of 3201 Idaho avenue N.W.
