Mrs. Julia A. Hammett Was widow of Former Official

Mrs. Julia Augusta Hammett, 82 years old, widow of Dr. Charles M. Hammett, one of the first health officers of the District of Columbia, died of heart disease at her residence, 1713 Rhode Island avenue, yesterday afternoon.

Mrs. Hammett was the daughter of the late Francis Maddox and Mrs. Loretta Maddox of St. Mary's County, Md. She was a direct descendant of many of the early settlers of that State.

Funeral services will be conducted at the residence tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock. Rev. George W. VanFossen, formerly rector of Trinity Episcopal Church, of which Mrs. Hammett was a member for many years, will officiate. Interment will be in Congressional Cemetery. Mrs. Hammett is survived by a son, Dr. Charles M. Hammett, jr.; three daughters, Mrs. William R. Myers, Mrs. Thomas Nelson Conrad and Miss Lucy Hammett, and a grandson, Frank H. Myers; all of this city. An only sister, Mrs. Georgia Slye of St. Mary's County, died about a month ago.
