J.B. Hammond, 78 Dies at Wesley Heights, D.C.

Resident of District for Many Years and Union Veteran of the Civil War

J.B. Hammond, seventy-eight years old, an assistant building inspector of the District and veteran of the civil war, died last night at his home, 3200 46th street, Wesley Heights, D.C., following an illness of six weeks. Funeral services have not been arranged definitely, but will be held Monday at Metropolitan M.E. Church. Interment is to be at Congressional cemetery.

Mr. Hammond was born September 26, 1837 at Hampstead, Md. He had lived in the District since he was a young man, for many years being engaged in the manufacture of building materials. At the time of his death he was superintendent of building and grounds at the American University, and an assistant building inspector of the District.

Mr. Hammond marched in the G.A.R. encampment parade in this city last fall, covering the entire distance. He was a member of a G.A.R. post at Harrisburg, Pa.

Besides his wife, two daughters are living, Mrs. E. Lycett of this city and Mrs. David Weaver of North Carolina.
