John T. Hatton, for more than 35 years a member of the local police force, died suddenly yesterday at his home, 452 M street s.w., Mr. Hatton had worked all day. When he returned home he went to his room. A short time later, when his son, John T. Hatton, jr. went to call his father for supper he found him lying on his bed unconscious. He died before medical assistance could be obtained. Most of the time Mr. Hatton had been on the police force he spent in the Fourth precinct.
