### **Edith Hawes, Shop Owner Here, Dies**

Edith S. Hawes, 85, who furnished many lamps for the White House and American Embassies abroad, died here yesterday, after a long illness.

For 40 years Mrs. Hawes operated the Gift and Craft Shop at 1228 Connecticut ave. nw., where she lived. Her little shop specialized in household ornaments, particularly lamps and shades. One of her best customers was Grace Coolidge, wife of President Calvin Coolidge.

Mrs. Hawes, who lived most of her life in Washington, was encouraged to open her shop by Irving and Casson, the oldest cabinet makers and decorators in Boston. Over the years she developed a successful business, providing furniture for American embassies and legations all over the world.

She is survived by a nephew, James Crystal Smith, of 7005 East ave., Chevy Chase.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. Tuesday at Gawler's Chapel, 1756 Pennsylvania ave. nw., with interment at Congressional Cemetery.
