Elmont B. Hazard, 72, Washington Native, Retired GAO Lawyer

Elmont B. Hazard, 72, a retired General Accounting Office attorney, died Saturday night of a heart condition at Garfield Hospital. He lived at 1210 Holbrook terrace N.E.

Mr. Hazard, a native of Washington, lived for a number of years in Chevy Chase, Md. He attended Eastern High School and was a 1906 graduate of the George Washington University Law School.

As a youth Mr. Hazard worked as a Western Union messenger. In 1901 he joined the Post Office Department where he became a bond examiner. In 1916 he left the department to set up his own private law practice here. He married Miss Lillian Wooldridge of Melrose, Mass., in 1909.

In 1932, Mr. Hazard became a counsel for the Reconstruction Finance Corp. and the next year he was named an attorney with the Public Works Administration. He joined the GAO in 1939 and remained there until his retirement in 1948.

Mrs. Hazard died last year.

Mr. Hazard was a member of Lafayette Masonic Lodge and the District bar, the New York State bar and the Supreme Court bar. He also was a member of All Saints' Episcopal Church, Chevy Chase.

He is survived by a son, John Wharton Hazard, an associate editor here of the magazine, *The Changing Times*; two daughters, Charlotte Wooldridge Hazard of 1900 H street N.W., and Mrs. John Ropes, Stratford, Conn., and a brother, Dr. Henry B. Hazard, formerly with the

Justice Department here, now living in Hyannis, Mass.
