Mary Hazard, Widely Known Musician Dies

Served as Pianist With Opera Association Sousa Directed

Mrs. Mary B. Hazard, 86, of 3319 Holmead place, well known in Capital music circles since the War Between the States, died early yesterday at her residence.

A native of Auburn, N.Y., she was the daughter of Dr. Amon C. and Sarah Seymour Taber. She came to Washington when her father was ordered on duty at what is now Theodore Roosevelt Island.

For many years Mrs. Hazard served as pianist with the old Washington Operatic Association, of which John Philip Sousa was director. She also was organist in several Washington churches, and was the first organist of Esther Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star.

Surviving Mrs. Hazard is a brother, Edward M. Taber, of this city, and three sons, Eugene J. Hazard, of Allentown, Pa.; Lieut. Col. W. Laurence Hazard, of Washington, and Frederic S. Hazard, of Long Island, N.Y.
