Mrs. Mary Catherine Hazen, widely known for her work in the Methodist Episcopal Church circles of Washington, aged seventy-nine years, died yesterday at the home of her only son, Ernest C. Hazen, 517 H street northwest, after a short illness. A short funeral service will be held at the home Sunday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock, followed by a regular public funeral from the Ryland Methodist Episcopal Church, 10th and D streets southwest, Rev. J. Thomas Hart, the pastor, officiating. The interment will be in Congressional cemetery, where five generations of the family are buried.

Mrs. Hazen was a native of Stafford county, Va. She had resided in this city nearly all of her life, having come to Washington when a young girl. She was the widow of A.N. Hazen, who died twenty years ago and who, following the close of the civil war, established himself in the flour and feed business at 463-465 K street southwest, which he conducted up to the time of his death. Mrs. Hazen was one of four generations that were christened in old Foundry Methodist Church, the generations having been represented by her mother, herself, a son and a granddaughter.

For many years she had been a member of and an active worker in old Foundry Methodist Church, leaving that congregation when the family moved into the southeast, affiliating herself with Ryland Methodist Church, it being more convenient than her old church. She is survived by an only son, Ernest C. Hazen of this city, with whom she had made her home for some time.
