Death of One of the Guiteau Jurors

Mr. Thomas W. Heinline, a well known citizen of East Washington, died at his residence, 511 8th street east, yesterday morning, aged about 50 years. Mr. Heinline was a native of this city, and learned the trade of machinist in the Washington navy yard. During the war he entered the naval service as a volunteer engineer, and served in the Potomac flotilla and the Atlantic squadron. After the war he made a trip to Europe on the monitor Mantonomah, and subsequently he was in the service of the light house board. Mr. Heinline will be remembered as one of the jurors in the trial of Guiteau for the murder of President Garfield. Recently he has filled a position as clerk in the Surgeon General's office. He leaves a family, a wife and five children, nearly all grown. His funeral will take place on Wednesday.
