Charles Edward Henderson, With Old Tobacco Firm

Charles Edward Henderson, 83, formerly a member of the William A Henderson Co. tobacco firm, which was established here during the Civil War, died yesterday at Sibley Memorial Hospital.

A third generation Washingtonian, Mr. Henderson was associated with the tobacco firm, which was located at Fifteenth street and New York avenue until it was dissolved in 1925.

He then became associated with Woodward & Lothrop, the Folger Shakespeare Library and the National Capital Bank.

CHARLES E. HENDERSON Mr. Henderson was active in the Second Baptist Church, where he succeeded his father as treasurer, and in the Sunday School, a position he held for 50 years. He also served as deacon until the past winter, when the church moved to College Park, Md. He then joined the Metropolitan Baptist Church.

A Mason, Mr. Henderson was a member of Naval Lodge for more than 55 years.

He leaves his wife, the former Altie Hulett, of 124 Fifth street S.E., the home address, for nearly 60 years. Also surviving are four daughters, Mrs. Lois M. Germer, of 9234 Riggs road, Adelphi, Md.; Mrs. Muriel L. Hosier, of 5815 Twenty-fourth avenue, Hillcrest Heights, Md.; Miss Alice R. Henderson of the home address, and Mrs. Eleanor H.
