Julian Paul Hendley Funeral Rites Held

Funeral services for Julian Paul Hendley, 85, who died at his home, 1733 Twentieth street, N.W., Sunday were held this afternoon at the Lee funeral home. He was buried in Congressional Cemetery.

Mr. Hendley had a record of continuous Government service from 1884 until his retirement from the Bureau of Mines in June, 1932. Before establishment of the Bureau of Mines in 1910, he was employed at the Geological Survey. During the World War he was temporarily transferred to the Chemical Warfare Service.

From the beginning of the National Geographic Society lecture program 55 years ago until recently Mr. Hendley was in charge of arrangements at the lecture hall. He was a native of Munday's Point, Va.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Anna E. Hendley; a son, Albert Julian Hendley of the General Accounting Office; two granddaughters, Mrs. Marguerite H. Loftus and Miss Audrey Alexander; two grandsons, James Mills Hendley and Albert Julian Hendley, jr., now in the armed service, and a great-grandson, Peter Loftus, jr. All of the survivors live in Washington, DC.
