Mrs. Amelia Gwinn Barber Henry, 94, a resident of the Washington area for more than 70 years, died of a stroke yesterday in her home at 4208 Military Road NW.

A native of Mechanicsville, Md., Mrs. Henry came to Washington in 1889. She and her husband, the late Samuel W. Henry, who died in 1930, operated the S.W. Henry Grocery store at 1917 Pennsylvania Ave.

She was a member of the United Daughters of the Confederacy, J.E.B. Stuart Chapter, and the Eastern Star Gavel Chapter.

She leaves two sisters, Mrs. William Richards of 921 Butternut St. NW, and Mrs. Samuel Goodacres of Santa Monica, Calif.; one brother, William C.
