**Newton Hilliard, 93, Is Claimed By Death
Veteran of Civil War, Who Marched With Sherman
Had Lived Here 40 Years**

Newton Hilliard, Civil War veteran and retired coal merchant, 93 years old, died yesterday at his residence, 404 A street southeast. He was a captain in the 179th Ohio Infantry and was with Gen. Sherman in his famous march to the sea.

Mr. Hilliard, who resided here 40 years, was in the coal business at 1544 Pennsylvania avenue for 15 years under the name of N. Hilliard Co. His wife, Mrs. Agnes L. Chandler Hilliard, died in 1911.

He is survived by a son, Clement B. Hilliard of this city. Funeral services will be held Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the home. Rev. W.H. Pettus of St. Mark's Episcopal Church will officiate. Interment will be in Congressional Cemetery.
