Relatives, a Servant and Charitable Causes Are Remembered

The will of James H. Hilton, dated September 7, 1900, and modified by codicils of October 7, 912 and October 3, 1917, has been filed for probate. J. Franklin Hilton, a son, is given his personal effects at 4418 14th street northwest and cash and bonds in bank or trust companies. Samuel L. Hilton, another son, is to have the income from \$5,000 for life; a niece, Sarah C. Hilton, the income from \$4,000, and a stepdaughter, Mrs. John H. Burch, the interest on \$3,000 for life. Mary Thomas, a servant is given \$360. A life interest in the remaining estate is given to the son, Franklin, and a daughter, Catharine S. Hilton.

Should all the beneficiaries die without issue the income from the estate is to be applied to the relief of indigent and destitute white widows more than fifty-eight years of age for fifteen years. The fund is then to be divided between the Little Sisters of the Poor and the Home for Incurables. Robert L. O'Brien and J. Franklin Hilton are named as executors.
