Burial of a Brother of Swiss Consul, General Hitz -

The remains of Rudolph H. Hitz, assistant surgeon U.S. Army, and brother of John Hitz, Esq., Swiss Consul General, arrived here yesterday afternoon, and were interred in the family lot in the Congressional Cemetery, the funeral being attended by the family of the deceased, besides a number of his personal friends residing on Capitol Hill, his former home. Dr. Hitz, as stated in The Star at that time, died of paralysis at Fort Shaw, Montana Territory on December 31st last, and his remains were taken charge of and forwarded to this city by Mr. William Gaddis, formerly of Washington, but now a resident of Montana.
