George Hodgkins, 78, D.C. School Educator

Dr. George W. Hodgkins, an educator with the D.C. public school system and a lifelong resident of the District, died Sunday at the Mar-Salle Convalescent Home here. Dr. Hodgkins, who was 78, lived at 1832 Biltmore St. N.W.

A native of Washington, Dr. Hodgkins graduated from Central High School in 1909, and attended George Washington University where he earned his bachelor's, master's and doctorate degrees.
