C.G. Hoffman, Native of D.C., Once FTC Aide

Charles Griffith Hoffman, 82, a native of Washington and former Federal Trade Commission official, died yesterday in Leesburg, Va., after a long illness.

Mr. Hoffman was the son of the late Dr. Walter James Hoffman and Mary Frances Davis Hoffman, a member of an old Washington family.

He attended private schools in the District and George Washington University. He also studied at the University of Heidelberg when his father was United States Consul in Germany.

Mr. Hoffman retired from the FTC in 1920 because of ill health. From 1944 until last year he lived in Emmitsburg, Md. At the time of his death his home was with his daughter, Mrs. Marion O'Kelley, in Leesburg.

He was a member of the Sons of the American Revolution and the Episcopal Church.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Gertrude Hoffman; his daughter and two grandsons.

Funeral arrangements are being made in Leesburg.

Leesburg, Va., April 27 (Special) -- Charles Griffith Hoffman, 82, died at a Leesburg nursing home today following a long illness.

Mr. Hoffman was a native of Washington and was educated at private schools and George Washington University. He also studied at the University of Heidelberg in Germany.

He was an employe of the Federal Trades Commission for many years until his resignation due to ill health in 1920. He had been a resident of Emmitsburg, Md., since 1944, coming to Leesburg last year to make his home with his son-in-law and daughter, Dr. and Mrs. Marion O'Kelley.

He is survived by his wife, Gertrude Hoffman, his daughter and two grandsons. He was a member of the Sons of the American Revolution and of the Episcopal Church.
