Hollis Funeral Rites At Home Tomorrow

Navy Yard Electrician Closely Identified With Masonic Organization

Funeral services for Frank J. Hollis, 57 years old., master electrician at the Navy Yard, who died suddenly Sunday at his home, 1344 Longfellow street, will be held at the home at 2 o'clock tomorrow.

Mr. Hollis was born in Martinsburg, W. Va., in 1873. In 1899 he came to this city, where he established permanent residence and began a long service in the electrical plating division of the Washington Navy Yard. At the time of his death Mr. Hollis held the position of quartermaster and master electrical plater. Mr. Hollis was closely identified with local Masonry, being a member of the Naval Lodge, Royal Arch Chapter and the Almas Temple.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Mamie C. Hollis; two sons, Eugene and Frank J. Hollis, jr., and a sister, Nellie V. Hollis.

Burial will be in Congressional cemetery.
