Joseph D. Hopkins Dies As Result of Accident

Was Knocked Down in Street by Automobile September 29 -- Coroner Orders Inquest

Joseph D. Hopkins, seventy-four years old, 712 A street northeast, who was struck by an automobile in front of 317 Pennsylvania avenue the morning of September 29, died at Casualty Hospital this morning about 7 o'clock. Coroner Nevitt arranged to hold an inquest at the morgue late this afternoon.

Mr. Hopkins was run down just after he stepped from the sidewalk on the south side of Pennsylvania avenue between intersecting streets to cross to the north side. Elmer Glascoe, colored, in the employ of a motor company, was operating the car going east on Pennsylvania avenue.

When the injured man reached Casualty Hospital it was found he had suffered a fracture of his left leg and a scalp wound. He also was suffering from concussion of the brain. He was a native of Maryland, a retired paperhanger and is survived by his wife, one son and three daughters.
