R.C. Howard Dies of Heart Attack

Real Estate and Insurance Man Was Native of District -- 62 Years Old

Stricken with heart disease shortly after he had left his daughter at school, Robert C. Howard, widely

known real estate and insurance man, a member of the firm of Bradley, Beall & Howard, died yesterday at his home, 1872 Newton street.

Mr. Howard, who was born in Washington 62 years ago and had lived here all his life, had taken his daughter, Jean Ross Howard, to Western High School and was on his way downtown when stricken. He died later at his home.

Well known in realty circles and a member of the Washington Board of Trade nearly 35 years, Mr. Howard attended the public schools and Central High School here. Funeral services will be held tomorrow at 10 a.m. at St. Paul's Catholic Church, Fifteenth and V streets. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.

Honorary pallbearers will be Corcoran Thom, Henry P. Blair, Joshua Evans, jr.; Joseph D. Sullivan, C.F.R. Ogilvy and George O. O'Connor, all close friends of Mr. Howard. Active pallbearers will be Eugene Goff, Charles R. Dayton, Paul E. Lesh, Avon M. Nevius, William M. Beall and James W. Murphy, also friends of Mr. Howard.
