Falling Tree Kills Man Searching For Honey

Stung by Bee, He Jumps Into Path of Crushing Timber

Steward H. Howard, thirty-five years old, 144 Anacostia road, near Twining City, was crushed by a falling tree near his home shortly before 6 o'clock yesterday morning. His skull was fractured and he received internal injuries. He died at Casualty Hospital yesterday afternoon.

Howard, a former sailor, and his brother Richard were out early in the morning to fell the tree. According to Richard Howard, as the tree was felled it crashed against another one nearby. The impact broke off a large branch from the one that was axed, throwing it against Steward. Winfield Shelby, also an occupant of the Anacostia road dwelling, took the injured man to Casualty Hospital. Coroner Nevitt gave a certificate of accidental death.

The funeral will be held tomorrow afternoon from the home of his brother, Edgar A. Howard, 3914 13th street northwest. The deceased is survived by his wife and four children.
