Mrs. Franklin T. Howe Dies In Brookland

Widow of Former News Editor of The Star Was Lifelong Resident of City

Mrs. Franklin T. Howe, widow of Dr. Howe, for twenty-five years news editor, dramatic editor and music critic on The Star, died yesterday afternoon at her home, 1230 Quincy street, Brookland, following a week's illness.
