When he retired in 1945, Mr. Howe had been with the Gas Company more than 30 years. He also had worked for several years at the Navy Yard here.

A native of Annapolis, Mr. Howe moved to Washington as a young man and played baseball for several semi-professional teams in the area. He served in the Navy during the Spanish-American War.
