William H. Howlin, 70, a Washington native who had been on the staff of the American Federation of Labor since 1906, died yesterday in Georgetown University Hospital after a long illness.

Mr. Howlin was still active in the AFL at the time he was taken ill. He had been secretary to the Federation's secretary. During his long service he had worked with all three AFL presidents, Samuel Gompers, William Green and George Meany.

Active in Masonry, Mr. Howlin had been a member of the Washington Centennial Lodge and the Almas Temple. He lived here at 3636 Sixteenth street N.W.

A bachelor, he is survived only by one brother, Thomas H. Howlin of 3338 D street S.E.

Funeral services will be held at Hines funeral home, 2901 Fourteenth street N.W., at 1 p.m. Monday. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.
