Toll Of Notables Is Undiminished

Funeral services for Gloria John Hunt, whose death occurred Thursday morning, will be held at 2 o'clock this afternoon at Speare's chapel, 940 F street.

Miss Hunt was the daughter and only child of Mrs. Alice Underwood Hunt and the late Alexander C. Hunt, a former governor of Colorado. She was a resident of this city throughout her life of twenty-seven years.

Interment will be made in Congressional cemetery, beside the body of Gov. Hunt. His resting place there is marked with a boulder from Ute pass, Colorado, presented by early residents of the state to commemorate his going alone and unarmed to attend a council of warring Indians over the pass which no white man was allowed to cross, and by which he obtained a treaty of peace between the Indians and early settlers of the state.
