On Tuesday morning, the 8th instant, in the seventy-fifth year of her age, Mrs. Jane Hyatt, for fifty-nine years a resident of this city. Her friends and the friends of the family are respectfully invited to attend her funeral from her late residence, No. 339 Pennsylvania avenue, opposite the Metropolitan Hotel, on Thursday morning next, the 10th instant as 12 o'clock.
