Fritz W. Isemann Dead

Member of Noted Family of Musicians Passes Away

The death of Fritz W. Isemann occurred Saturday afternoon at the family residence, 311 C street southeast, and the funeral will take place at 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon from the family home. Deceased was thirty-two years of age, having been born in this city August 9, 1874. His death occurred after a lingering illness from a pulmonary trouble.

Mr. Isemann had many friends in local musical circles, he having been a member of the Washington Symphony Orchestra when Reginald DeKoven was its director. He was educated in Europe, having spent four years at Weimar.

He was a son of the late Henry Isemann, who was a native of Frankenthal, Bavaria, but who came to Washington early in his life and was engaged for more than twenty-five years in the leather and shoe-finding business.

George Isemann, brother of the deceased, was also a noted pianist, having won distinction by his solo work. Mr. Fritz Isemann was also noted for his musical work, and while abroad he attracted much attention from master musicians because of his accomplishments.
