Exposure Held Cause of Death of Man, 79

A 79-year-old man died at Casualty Hospital yesterday, a day after he was found unconscious in his frigid apartment and Coroner A. Magruder MacDonald attributed death to exposure.

John P. Jackson, 216 Fourth street S.E., was found unconscious at about 10 a.m. Tuesday by Leslie A. Fritter, a roomer at the apartment building, who had forced his way into Mr. Jackson's apartment through a door which had trunk against it. He died at 12:25 p.m. yesterday.

Mr. Jackson was reported to have been a special government agent in the early 1920s. He also had been a bank clerk, it was reported. He was a past master of New Jerusalem Masonic Lodge, No. 9.

Mr. Friteer, a traveling salesman, said he last saw Mr. Jackson going out for food Friday. Coroner MacDonald said Mr. Jackson probably had not eaten for four days when he was discovered.

Mr. Fritter found the heat on in the room, but windows were open and the temperature was low.

Survivors include the widow, Mrs. Alice V. Jackson, 1009 Eleventh street N.W.; a daughter, Mrs. Alice Neal, 2141 I street N.E., Veterans' Administration employe, and a son, Carlisle Jackson, Los Angeles.

Funeral services will be held Friday at Gawler's funeral home, 1756 Pennsylvania avenue N.W., but the time has not been set. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.
