Miss Jay, Lifetime Resident of Hill

Miss India Jay, retired Library of Congress employe, who had spent all her life on Capitol Hill, died Sunday in Emergency Hospital.

Miss Jay lived at 420 Seward square S.E., the house built by her grandfather, Richard M. Green. She was the daughter of the late Leonard B. Jay, a wood engraver, and the late Mrs. Mabel Jay. She was a cousin of Hobart Nichols, New York artist, who heads the National Academy of Art in New York.

Miss Jay retired from the Card Division of the library in 1954 after 12 years' service.

Survivors are a brother, Leonard B. Jay, retired chief of engineering, refrigerating and air conditioning at the Senate Office Building, and a sister, Mrs. Susan Gertrude Jay Scott, both of the Seward square address.

Services were to be held at 3:30 p.m. today in the Lee funeral home, Fourth and Massachusetts avenue N.E., with private burial.

An amateur artist, she specialized in oil landscape and portrait painting.
