Dr. Johnson's Funeral Tomorrow Afternoon

Physician Had Practiced Medicine Here Nearly Fifty Years

Dr. A.E. Johnson, for nearly fifty years a practicing physician of this city and a civil war veteran, died yesterday at his home in the Denver, 1419 Chapin Street northwest.

Funeral services will be held at 3 o'clock tomorrow afternoon from the residence. They will be under the auspices of the Grand Army of the Republic and the Masonic fraternity.

Dr. Johnson enlisted at the beginning of the civil war in Company C, 5th Pennsylvania Reserves, a notable organization, and was severely wounded in the peninsula campaign. He was left for dead on the battlefield and remained uncared for for several days. His injuries proved to be so severe that he had to be discharged from the service. While recovering he studied medicine and began practice in this city, where he resided for forty-seven years prior to his death.

Interested in G.A.R.

Dr. Johnson took a warm interest in the Grand Army of the Republic, being a member of Lincoln Post and the Old Guard. He had served as surgeon of the post, surgeon of the Department of the Potomac, G.A.R., and surgeon general of the Grand Arm of the Republic. His widow, Mrs. Annie W. Johnson, is past president of the Department of the Potomac, W.R.C.

Dr. Johnson was also an earnest and faithful Mason, being a Knight Templar.
