Died -- On Saturday last (Dec. 30, 1820) Mrs. Louisa C. Johnson, consort of Dr. Richmond Johnson, of this city, in the 25th year of her age. This pious and accomplished lady had for the last two years been in a declining state of health, during which she exhibited all the patience, benignity, and submission, of the genuine Christian -- intermingling to the end, though under severe suffering, cheerfulness with resignation in her intercourse with her anxious and affectionate surrounding friends -- thus evidencing the superiority of that faith on which she reposed: so that "Death had" for her "no sting," and "the Grave" over her "no victory." The only pang she felt was not for herself, but on account of the anguish which a devoted husband and the nearest and dearest relatives would suffer from the separation.
