## Large Funeral.

The funeral of the late James L. Kelley took place from his late residence in the 6th Ward, yesterday afternoon and was attended by the Grand Lodge and Grand Encampment, Ridgeley Encampment No. 5 and Friendship Lodge No. 12 of Odd Fellows, Washington Grove, No. 1, U.A.O. Druids, Capitol Lodge A.O. Goodfellows and Hiram Lodge of Masons the procession was accompanied by the Marine Band in two sections. The remains were conveyed to the Congressional Cemetery where the imposing ceremonies of the several Orders to which the deceased had been attached took place. Mr. Kelley was aged about 45 years and was a blacksmith by occupation and for the last 8 years has had charge of the horse-shoeing department of the Government at the Lincoln depot, and was universally beloved by all who knew him.
