Walter A. Kibbey, 32 years old, World War veteran and son of T. Edward and Mrs. Lillian L. Kibbey of 1401 Emerson street, died in Denver, Colo., Friday, after a long illness. The body is expected to arrive in Washington tonight at 10 o'clock, and services will be conducted at Gawler's chapel, 1730 Pennsylvania avenue, tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock. Interment will be in Congressional cemetery.

Mr. Kibbey was formerly secretary of the National Lime Association, and also was in the real estate business here for a while. He was a member of Mount Pleasant Lodge, No. 33, F.A.A.M., and of the American Legion. He had gone to Denver for his health. Besides his parents, he leaves a brother, Edward W. Kibbey.
