Gertrude L. Ladson, 83, District Teacher 47 Years

Miss Gertrude L. Ladson, 83, a Washington school teacher 47 years, died at Holy Cross Hospital Thursday after a long illness.

A native of Washington, Miss Ladson began her career in 1901 at the Petworth Elementary School. She later helped establish MacFarland Junior High School, where she taught English and medieval and modern history from 1923 to her retirement in 1948.

A world traveler, she often visited Europe and the Orient and did research work at the Oriental University, Jerusalem.

Miss Ladson was a former editor of the D.C. Teachers Association Magazine, a member of the National Education Association, of the National Education Association, of the National Baptist Memorial Church, and she was active with the Red Cross and the Boy Scouts of America. Several years ago she collaborated on a history of the National Baptist Memorial Church.
