His funeral will take place on Sunday evening from his late residence, No. 216 6th street northwest at half past one o'clock and from St. Patrick's church at half past 2. The Evening Star, November 29, 1878

Mr. John Langley, the well-known proprietor of Langley's saloon, on 6th street near Pennsylvania avenue, died this morning after an illness of about a week. Mr. Langley was a native of East Washington, and for many years was the bar-keeper at the National Hotel, but some two years ago he went into business on his own account. He was a genial gentleman, and had many friends in this city, who will sympathize with his family--a widow and two children.

The Evening Star, December 2, 1878

The Funeral of Mr. John Langley, the well-known restaurateur, took place yesterday afternoon from his late residence, on 6th street, between Pennsylvania avenue and C street n.w., and was largely attended. At St. Patrick's church Father Walter conducted the services at the conclusion of which the cortege proceeded to Congressional cemetery, where the burial took place.
