## Fire Kills Mrs. LeDane, Daughter and Her Son

## D.C. Woman, Aged 78, Had Just Gone to Harper's Ferry Home of Mrs. Moore

Mrs. Eliza J. LeDane, seventy-eight years old, Mrs. Bentley Moore, her daughter, and Harold Moore, small son of the latter, were burned to death in a fire which destroyed the Moore home yesterday on a farm near Harpers Ferry, W. Va. A daughter of Mrs. Moore was badly burned.

Mrs. LeDane lived with another daughter, Mrs. J.H. Hollsiter, 320 D street S.E. and had only the day before gone to visit her daughter, Mrs. Moore. The latter attempted to rescue her mother but was burned to death in the effort. The body of Mrs. LeDane was brought to Washington today.
