Mrs. Mary A. Linkins Dies In Her 93d Year

Last of Original Members of St. Paul's English Lutheran Church of This City

Mrs. Mary Ann Linkins, lifelong resident of this city, died yesterday, in her ninety-third year, at her residence, 1923 G street. She was the daughter of William Woodward, who was connected with the National Intelligencer from 1826 to 1862. Mrs. Linkins was the widow of William Linkins and was born October 7, 1826 in a house on 10th street between D and E streets. She was a member since 1843 of St. Paul's English Lutheran Church, and was the last one of the first catechetical class taken into the communion of the church when the congregation was organized.

She is survived by a brother, Luther Woodward, of this city; two sons, George W. Linkins of this city and William W. Linkins of Aspen, Colo.; a daughter, Esther R. Linkins of this city; eight grandchildren, George R., Charles William H., Luther W., Esther and Flora May Linkins all of this city, and William and Myron Linkins of Aspen, Colo., and five great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held at the residence tomorrow morning at 11 o'clock. Interment will be private in Congressional cemetery.
