### **Mrs. M.A. Long Dies Day After Husband Buried**

#### **Both Are Victims of Influenza, Survived by Two-Month-Old Baby**

Mrs. Maud A. Long, aged nineteen, died of influenza Tuesday, the day after her husband, Samuel C. Long was buried in Mount Olivet cemetery. He also was a victim of influenza. The youthful couple are survived by a two months' old baby son.

The funeral of Mrs. Long was conducted at her late residence, 804 I street, this afternoon. Burial was made at the Congressional cemetery.

Both Mr. and Mrs. Long were residents and natives of Washington, having attended the public schools together and grown up as children in the same neighborhood. They were married a short time ago. Mr. Long had been employed by the Terminal Taxi Company.

The husband died last Saturday, after being ill nine days. Sunday evening Mrs. Long was stricken, and was not able to attend her husband's burial.

Mrs. Long was the oldest daughter of J.C. Laurie, for many years an employe of the District engineer's office. Mr. Long was the son of William Long of this city.
