James T. Lowe Dies; Long Pennsy Employe

James T. Lowe, 76, former Pennsylvania Railroad freight division employe, died at Doctors Hospital yesterday. He was stricken the day before with a cerebral hemorrhage.

He was the division's oldest employe in point of service when he retired in 1938.

Mr. Lowe, who lived at 1821 Potomac avenue S.E., was born in Baltimore and was a member of one of Maryland's oldest families. He came here from his grandparents' tobacco farm at Croome, Md., when he was 24 and began work with the railroad.

After his retirement from the railroad, Mr. Lowe became night superintendent at the Investment Building, a position he held until his death.

Mr. Lowe is survived by his widow, Mrs. Sallie Gallehue Lowe, two sons, J. Russell Lowe of the Potomac avenue address, and William S. Lowe, 2323 Fortieth place N.W.; two sisters, Mrs. Effie C. Ryon, 4421 New Hampshire avenue N.W., and Mrs. William T. Davis, Upper Marlboro, Md., and two brothers, Maurice P. Lowe of the New Hampshire avenue address, and Charles M. Lowe, Mount Airy, Md.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. tomorrow in Christ Episcopal Church, 620 G street S.E., where Mr. Lowe had been a vestryman. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.
