Mrs. W. MacDonald Buried Yesterday

Former Washington Resident Died in Chicago While on Honeymoon

Funeral service for Mrs. William MacDonald, 52, formerly of this city, and who died in Chicago Tuesday while on a belated honeymoon, were conducted yesterday morning at 10:30 o'clock by the Rev. William H. Pettus, rector of St. Mark's Episcopal church, in the undertaking establishment of James T. Ryan, 317 Pennsylvania avenue southeast. Burial was in Congressional cemetery.

Mrs. MacDonald, who resided in this city for many years, was the widow of C.E. Linch, when in January she was married to Mr. MacDonald, in Ithaca, N.Y. The bridegroom was in poor health and the honeymoon was postponed until March 29, when doctors thought it safe for him to take the trip, which was to include California.

At the time she left Ithaca, Mrs. MacDonald appeared to be in excellent health. Her maiden name was Mary Schwint and she was the daughter of John Schwint, who now lives in Reading, Pa. She was born in York, Pa. She is survived by her second husband and one son, Mark N. Linch, an employe of the War Department, who resides at 136 East Capitol street.
