Woman Hit By Patrol Succumbs At Hospital

Mrs. Mary Mack, twenty-eight years old, of 323 E street southeast, who was knocked down b y a patrol automobile from the fourth precinct yesterday afternoon, died early last night at Casualty Hospital from the injuries.

The accident occurred at 4th and D streets southeast, when she stepped off a curb into the path of the approaching automobile operated by L.L. Jackson of the fourth precinct. The accident is said to have been unavoidable. An inquest will be held at the morgue tomorrow.

Colored Policeman Held

Lawrence Jackson to Face Grand Jury Following Fatal Patrol Mishap

At an inquest conducted by Coroner Nevitt at the District morgue yesterday, Lawrence Jackson, a colored policeman of the Fourth precinct detailed as an automobile driver, was held for the action of the grand jury in connection with the death of Mary Mack, 323 E street southeast, Saturday morning.

The automobile patrol of the Fourth precinct, driven by Jackson, was making a run, and at Fourth and D streets southeast struck the Mack woman, it is alleged, knocking her down. Five hours later she died at Casualty hospital. Immediately after the verdict Jackson was suspended from the force and a charge of manslaughter was lodged against him. Later he was released on bond of \$2,000.
