Victim of Blood Poisoning

Timothy E. Mannix Dead Result of a Slight Injury

Timothy E. Mannix, one of the most popular employes of the New Varnum Hotel, and well known among members of Congress, died yesterday from blood poisoning. Funeral services are to be held at his late residence, 9 C street southeast, at 9 o'clock Thursday morning.

Mr. Mannix was slightly injured in an automobile accident about three weeks ago, but the injury was not considered serious until he was forced to undergo an operation last Wednesday. Although the operation at first seemed successful, he sank into a coma Friday night and died yesterday morning. He leaves a wife and one child.
