Funeral Rites Today For Mrs. Marmaduke

Funeral services were to be held today for Mrs. Mary E. Marmaduke, 93, of 28 Lincoln avenue, Takoma Park, Md., a lifelong resident of the Washington area, who died Tuesday in Washington Sanitarium. She had been ill six months.

The services will be at 2 p.m., in Hines Funeral Home, 2901 Fourteenth street N.W. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.

Mrs. Marmaduke was educated in a convent. She had many memories of the Civil War and the Reconstruction period. Her father, Francis LaBarre, was killed at St. Petersburg, Va., while fighting on the Confederate side. He was a jeweler here when the conflict broke out.

Mrs. Marmaduke is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Ida M. Spence, with whom she lived at the Lincoln avenue address. There also are six grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

They are Adolphus Spence, Horace Browning Spence, Mrs. Frances Spence Shinner, Pierce LaBarre Spence and Maurice Spence, all of Washington, and Mrs. Suemarie Kassler of Dallas, Tex. The great-grandchildren are Horace Browning Spence, jr., 1 year old, and Suemarie Kassler, 4 years old.

Mrs. Marmaduke's husband, Rufus de Haas Marmaduke, died about 52 years ago.
